Programme Update

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AIG Public Leaders Programme



The AIG Public Leaders Programme identifies future leaders in the Nigerian public sector and provides them with the tools and resources they need for effective leadership, with the aim of restoring excellence in the country's public service.

Each candidate receives an academic scholarship worth £11,500 from the Foundation, to enable them to attend the programme.

Following a rigorous application process, 50 high-potential men and women working in the public service were selected to participate in the inaugural class of the programme, which is run in partnership with the Blavatnik School of Government, University of Oxford.

The programme, which commenced on 6th September, provides participants with the conceptual frameworks and practical tools they need to meet the challenges of public sector management in a complex and rapidly changing world.

The training program has been deeply engaging and calming on a personal level. The video interviews and questions require a deep interrogation of one's own personal thoughts/opinions on specific subject matters. The process of putting yourself in the shoe of the leader facing the challenge in the case studies and to come up with best decision option(s), is also a process of evaluating your true self. The portal is simple to navigate and use. I like that it requires you to confirm at the end of each task that you have completed the section and shows you your progress in relation to the class average.

Once they have completed their degrees, they return to their home countries and use their learnings to contribute to the development of their nations.




The 2021-22 AIG Scholars resumed their studies at the Blavatnik School of Government in September 2021.

LEAD-P


As part of our work to drive transformation of the Nigerian public sector, we are pleased to support the capacity building initiatives of the Office of the Head of the Civil Service of the Federation (OHCSF). To this end, we have been working with the OHCSF's Learning and Development teams to develop the strategy and content for the Leadership Enhancement and Development Programme (LEAD-P). LEAD-P is a top talent training programme designed to give civil servants who show high potential for leadership, the opportunity to further develop the skills needed to become the leaders of the future. Participants on the programme undertake rotational postings around the four major clusters of the civil service and participate in focused training

sessions, private sector internships and continuous online learning.

DIGITALISATION OF THE OHCSF – PROJECT UPDATE

Our partnership with the Office of the Head of the Civil Service of the Federation (OHCSF) dates back to 2017, when we engaged the services of McKinsey to develop the Federal Civil Service Strategy Implementation Plan (FCSSIP) which identified 8 priority areas for reform to drive the transformation of the Nigerian civil service. Since that time, we have been working with the OHCSF, supporting the implementation of some of the priority areas of the plan.

One of the priority areas we have been supporting the OHCSF is the digitalisation of the business processes of its 26 departments, to increase efficiency and effectiveness. The first step in the digitalisation project was the development of Standard Operating Procedures, which have been successfully completed and adopted by the departments. Currently, we are conducting Organisational Readiness Surveys, a gap analysis to determine the human and technical resources required for digitalisation. Once the gaps are identified, we will work with the OHCSF to ensure that the necessary resources are in place before the final stage of the digitalisation project, which is the implementation of the Enterprise Content Management Solution.

"Mainstreaming Private Sector Collaboration In Public Sector Reform" Webinar

Nigeria has a number of excellent and well-functioning, mutually beneficial public-private partnerships (PPPs) in place, but more can and ought to be done, to entrench collaboration between the country's private and public sectors.

Challenges need to be identified; best practice must be identified and entrenched; successes need to be celebrated and amplified; and, critically, PPPs must develop frameworks to address specific impediments to optimal service delivery to the public.

This was a primary observation by speakers at a webinar, titled *Mainstreaming Private Sector Collaboration in Public Service Reform*, which was held on 7 September 2021 and featured

speakers Ofovwe Aig-Imoukhuede (Executive Vice-Chair of the Aig-Imoukhuede Foundation), Simbi Wabote (Executive Secretary at the Nigerian Content Development and Monitoring Board) and Dr Gideon Adogbo (Special Technical Assistant to the head of the Civil Service of the Federation in Nigeria).
